Our ministry is to maintain a positive witness to the unchanging Gospel of Our Lord and Saviour JESUS CHRIST, the eternal Son of God, made Man by the Holy Ghost and born of the Blessed Virgin Mary; who offered Himself on the Cross, once for all, as the only sacrifice and satisfaction for our sin; who was raised bodily from the dead for our justification; whose coming in glory we joyfully await. In the Sacrament of the Altar (variously called the Lord's Supper, Holy Communion, Holy Eucharist, or Mass), He feeds us with His glorious Body and Blood, really present in the consecrated bread and wine. Thus He unites us with Himself and makes us to be His mystical Body. In the name of Christ, we bear witness to this Biblical and Catholic faith in its fullness and integrity.

In our worship, we use the 1928 Book of Common Prayer and are a parish of the Diocese of the South, the Anglican Catholic Church. We are located at 5041 Lakeshore Drive West, Fleming Island, FL, 32003.

The First Sunday after Epiphany

The Epiphany Proclamation

Good Christian People:

Just as we have celebrated, through the bounteous mercy of God, the Birth of Our Lord Jesus Christ and his Manifestation to the Gentiles, so with like joy should we announce the Resurrection of this same Incarnate God and Savior. Therefore, we solemnly proclaim to you, that this year of our Lord 2021, we will celebrate, with awe, reverence, and love, the Paschal Feast of **EASTER** on **THE FOURTH DAY OF APRIL**.

In this year, there will be THREE Sundays after the feast of the Epiphany. The THIRTY-FIRST day of JANUARY will be Septuagesima Sunday. The SEVENTEENTH day of FEBRUARY will be Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent.

Palm Sunday, the beginning of Holy Week, will be kept on the TWENTY-EIGHTH day of MARCH. The sacred Triduum will begin on the evening of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday being the day following in this most sacred week.

The Ascension of our Lord will be celebrated on the THIRTEENTH day of MAY. The Feast of Whitsunday will be celebrated on the TWENTY-THIRD day of MAY, and the feast of the Most Holy and Undivided Trinity on the THIRTIETH day of MAY. There will be TWENTY-FIVE Sundays after Trinity Sunday.

If the Lord tarry, yet another year of grace will commence on the TWENTY-EIGHTH day of NOVEMBER, that being the First Sunday of the Advent of Our Lord Jesus Christ, to whom be all honor and glory for ever and ever. *Amen.*
